Dear Parents:

Following is the list of supplies that we ask parents of lower-elementary students to provide for the class. **Please do not write your child's name on any of the supplies other than the large spiral notebook for spelling and the colored pocket folder for Spanish. Place your child's name on the spelling notebook and Spanish folder in the upper righthand corner with a permanent marker.** On the first day of school, supplies are pooled together and will be used by the class throughout the school year. For example, all students' pink erasers will be combined and placed in several containers to be used by all the students.

The school supplies can be generic, but we have found that the Crayola color pencils are best buy for the long haul. Here are the supplies:

Supply items and quantities:

- Large thick spiral notebook (qty. 1 - solid color, wide-rule, vinyl/plastic, 3-5 subjects)
 - Green Team – 1st year – solid green color
 - Blue Team – 2nd year – solid blue color
 - Red Team – 3rd year – solid red color
- Wide-ruled filler loose leaf notebook paper (qty. 1 - 100+ Wide Sheets)
- Mead composition notebook (qty. 2 - Black/White Marble only)
- Pocket Folders (qty. 2 - vinyl/plastic)
 - Green Team – 1st year – solid green colored pocket folders
 - Blue Team – 2nd year – solid blue colored pocket folders
 - Red Team – 3rd year – solid red colored pocket folders
- Pre-sharpened colored pencils (pack of 12, Crayola preferred)
- Glue sticks (pack of 2)
- Large bottle of Elmer's Glue (qty. 1 - white)
- Large pink erasers (pack of 2)
- Color (red, green and/or blue)** Expo Dry-Erase markers (pack of 2)
- Colored markers - broad line washable (pack of 12)
